is complemented by the park-like landscape of the estate and a comprehensive collection of original decorative art. Its noteworthy occupants included former New York City Mayor William Paulding, merchant George Merritt and railroad tycoon Jay Gould.



Described as one of the ten best decorated historic mansions by *USA Today*, Lyndhurst goes all out during the holidays with "A Very

Duchess Holiday." Lyndhurst is elaborately hung with an over-the-top display of holiday ornaments. Homage is also paid to the French Princess / Duchess, Anna Gould, the Duchess of Talleyrand, who was the last owner of Lyndhurst.

Our day will begin with a catered luncheon which we will enjoy inside the Carriage House. This beadboard paneled room is fully decorated with garlands, trees, and toys, creating a mood both elegant and festive. 


