





James Harvey "Harve" Doxsee was a well-known prominent Islip resident during the second half of the 19th century. Harve was a successful farmer and canned some of his farm produce. Around 1865, he expanded into the canning of clams and clam juice. He was a



pioneer in the field of canning clams, which were dug by the baymen of the local Great South Bay. Harve distributed his clam products nationwide. Bob Doxsee Jr. is Harve's great-grandson and the fourth generation of his family to follow in the Doxsee tradition of the seafood business. Bob's PowerPoint presentation is a combination of pictures and anecdotes that highlight a family enterprise spanning from the 1800s to the beginning of the 21st century.

# There is NO parking fee

- Cruise the bay that is the setting of F. Scott Fitzgerald's classic American novel. The Great Gatsby was set on that "slender riotous island which extends itself due east of New York otherwise known as Long Island."
- Join us for a two-hour boat tour on the Courtesy Bay, separating "the enormous eggs" which served as Fitzgerald's setting. We will envision where Gatsby's mansion might have stood gazing at the green light on Daisy's dock and exchange stories of the Roaring Twenties on Long Island, which was a microcosm of the United States pre-WWII revolution in manners and morals.
- The Great Gatsby boat tour has been operating since 2008 and here's a fun fact: Director/Producer Baz Luhrmann and Catherine Martin from the 2013 film *The Great Gatsby* were passengers on this boat tour!
- Please note: In the event of a small craft advisory, the boat tour will be rescheduled.

### Bus Trip to Ellis Island and Statue of Liberty ISA496 Friday, August 2

Bus departs Islip Library's parking lot: 7:00 am

Registration begins: Tuesday, April 30, at 5:30 pm Registration ends: Tuesday, July 2, at 9:00 pm No refunds will be issued after Tuesday, July 2 unless your seat can be filled by someone on the waiting list

- Depart from Islip Library by motorcoach and then take a ferry ride from **Battery Park to Ellis Island and the Statue of Liberty** (which closed as an immigration port in 1924).
- You will have approximately six to seven hours to tour both Liberty Island and Ellis Island at your own pace. Self-guided audio tours will be available.
- Ferries depart every 20 minutes between Liberty Island and Ellis Island. You can ferry back and forth between these islands with your ticket.
- Lunch is on your own; there are concession stands on both islands as well as a café at Ellis Island.
- Your ticket does **NOT** allow access to the pedestal or crown (you would have to purchase those separately, on your own, in advance of the trip). You **WILL** have access to the Statue of Liberty Museum which opened in May of 2019.
- **Security notice:** All visitors must pass through airport-style security before boarding the ferry at Battery Park. All items considered inappropriate or prohibited will be confiscated and retained by the United States Park Police. Large bags are not allowed on Liberty Island or Ellis Island.
- Cost for the trip includes transportation via Hampton Jitney motorcoach and admission to both Liberty Island and Ellis Island.
- Please note lunch and bus driver gratuity are not included in the cost. Approximate return time: 7:00 pm.

# FROM THE HELM

# A Brief Summary of Islip Library's Storied History....

- Prior to 1900, the Episcopal Church provided access to "library service."
- By 1900, a small group of residents form a Library Association to deliver library service to the community. Membership is one dollar for a year or 75 cents for six months. Subscribers may borrow books for five cents per week. By the end of the year, the Library is free of debt with a balance in the treasury of \$9.30.
- Between 1900 and 1923, the Library operates out of storefronts along Main Street.
- In 1923, the Library applies to New York State for a charter to become a true public library. The State inspector notes "a rather hit or miss collection" but commends the "earnest women" who are determined to make a success of the library push.
- In 1924, a Provisional Charter is granted. The Islip Public Library is officially formed. The Library is operated out of the high school "drawing room."

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- In 1940, the State grants the Library an Absolute Charter and the Library is operating out of the Goldsworth Building on the corner of Main Street and Monell Avenue.
- In 1956, a new Library building is dedicated on the "old school grounds" on Monell Avenue.
- In 1964, Islip Public Library becomes the first library in Suffolk County to hold its budget vote in a library building.
- In 1976, the newly expanded Islip Public Library reopens to the public.
- In 2001, the Library is expanded by 4,900 square feet to create a new Children's Department and a large community meeting space.
- In 2011, a renovation of the main floor provides an electrical foundation for expanding technologies and a first-ever Teen Room.
- In 2017, a terrace is added to merge the outdoors with library service.
- In 1920, the Library adapts to the pandemic by offering curbside and grab-n-go services as well as online programming.
- In 2024, the Library celebrates its 100th anniversary!
